

#### Respective Functions of the Board of Governors and the Principal in relation to admissions.

The Board of Governors draws up the admissions criteria and delegates responsibility for applying these criteria to an Admissions Sub-Committee who will apply the admissions criteria in the order indicated below to identify which children are to be admitted. Any reference herein to the term the Board of Governors includes any Sub-Committee appointed by the Board of Governors for the purposes of applying the admissions criteria. The criteria will be applied separately to applicants for full-time and part-time places.

#### **Admissions Criteria**

The application procedure opens on 7 January 2021 at 12noon (GMT) and an application submitted by the closing date of 29 January 2021 at 12noon (GMT) will be treated as a <u>punctual application</u>. An application received after 12noon (GMT) on 29 January 2021 will be treated as a <u>late application</u>.

As the <u>pre-school admissions procedure is in two stages</u> the timetable also specifies the relevant dates at Stage 2 which will determine if an application is to be considered as <u>punctual</u> or <u>late</u>.

1 Children from socially disadvantaged circumstances born between 2 July 2017 and 1 July 2018 (both dates inclusive).

Note: Children from 'socially disadvantaged circumstances' means a child whose parent is in receipt of (i) Income Support, or (ii) Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, or (iii) an award of Income Support which has been converted into an Employment and Support Allowance and the level of benefit remains the same, or (iv) Universal Credit. When parents apply for places for their child on this basis they must provide Benefit Verification to confirm that they are in receipt of a qualifying payment. This should be provided to the Pre-School of first preference and the application procedure for Pre-School will outline how this can be submitted.

2 Children not from socially disadvantaged circumstances born between 2 July 2017 and 1 July 2018 (both dates inclusive).

#### **Admissions Sub-Criteria**

In the event of oversubscription within either of the above criteria the children to be selected for admission will be identified by giving priority to:-

(i) Children in their final pre-school year who have listed Drumnamoe as their first preference.

#### **Randomised Selection:**

In the event of oversubscription within any of the above criterion, remaining places will be allocated on a randomised selection basis using Random.org to allocate a rank number at random to each application. The random selection will be carried out by the Sub-Committee of the Board of Governors, which will include the Principal.

(In the case of twins/multiple births, these applications will be treated as one application in the process).

The only documentation required is an original Birth Certificate in order to verify the age of a child.

#### Children in their penultimate pre-school year

In the event of there being places remaining after applying the criteria to all children in their final pre-school years, i.e. those born between 2 July 2017 and 1 July 2018 (inclusive), those remaining places will be allocated to children in their penultimate pre-school year, i.e. those born between 2 July 2018 and 1 July 2019 (inclusive). The places will be allocated according to chronological age, beginning with the oldest.

#### Admissions criteria for entry September 2021

Where two or more children have the same date of birth (except twins or multiple births) final selection will be on the basis of the alphabetical order of the surnames. If two or more children have the same surname the alphabetical order of the first forename will be used and if required thereafter subsequent forenames.

#### **Duty to Verify**

The Board of Governors reserves the right to require such supplementary evidence as it may determine to support or verify information on any applicant's application form.

If the requested evidence is not provided to the Board of Governors by the deadline given, this will result in the withdrawal of an offer of a place. Similarly, if information is supplied which appears to be false or misleading in any material way, the offer of a place will be withdrawn.

#### **Waiting List Policy**

The Board of Governors of Drumnamoe Nursery School operates a waiting list of those children who do not get placement. Should a vacancy arise after issue of placement letters, all applications for admission that were initially refused, new applications, late applications and applications where new information had been provided, will be treated equally and the published criteria applied. The waiting list will be in place until the end of the academic year.
